Brooke Weston Trust is a family of primary and secondary schools in Northamptonshire and Cambridgeshire. The Trust has a simple aim: to provide high-quality education and learning opportunities across its schools and to ensure that every child, no matter their background or starting point, leaves with the necessary qualifications, skills and selfbelief to fulfil their potential

To achieve this, all schools in the Trust commit to the 'BWT Way' – a set of shared expectations of how the schools should be and 'feel'. These are best defined by two key questions:

- Is this good enough for mv own child?
- Am I caring enough to challenge enough?

The experience each student receives at a Brooke Weston Trust school extends far

beyond the classroom, and aims to provide each student with 'tickets for life' - a phrase used to explain how students will leave education with the aualifications, skills and self belief to fulfil their potential.

Five core values underpin all the Trust's work:

- Ambition for all
- High expectations
- Excellent teaching and support
- Working together
- Contributing to society

Brooke Weston Trust schools regularly collaborate with each other to drive towards this ambition. This means that staff and pupils from across the Trust work together to support each other, share best practice and try new ideas. Over each academic year there are many opportunities for pupils from all our schools to meet, compete and celebrate success together.



To help realise our aims and to secure the best possible outcomes for our children we offer a rich and varied curriculum. We take part in a variety of competitions and events including many inter-school competitions. We offer music lessons in drums, piano, woodwind and brass.

We include exciting enterprise activities within the curriculum and all classes have their own pot of money which they can spend on their initiatives, the profits from which they can choose to spend on their class, the school or a charity. Enterprise projects really capture the children's imagination and give them an enthusiasm for learning the skills needed to carry them out.

The academy runs a variety of sports, creative and academic clubs that the children are able to attend.

We value the importance of pupil's voice and have regular "Snack and Chat" sessions for the children to discuss their learning. We also provide many opportunities for children to take on responsibilities and children can aspire to be school ambassadors, reading leaders, buddies or servers at lunchtime

We have a school council and sports crew who encourage their peers to lead a healthy, active lifestyle. We run a Forest School in

the pocket park in Gretton. This enables the children to participate in outdoor learning, providing opportunities to gain and develop confidence and self-esteem through hands-on learning experiences in a natural environment. This learning experience is child-initiated and child-led where adults assist the children in learning at their own pace.

All of this exciting activity takes place in and around our historic 100-year-old Victorian building, which has been extended and refurbished to offer a 21st century learning environment. This is surrounded by a playground, which is a hive of activity with equipment helping to develop our children's imaginative play. Beyond the playground is our unique orchard which has a trim trail, climbing frame, gazebo willow tunnel, play house, outdoor performance area and a creative space with a story-telling stage. We also have five lovely chickens who reside in a coop in our arounds.

We provide a Breakfast and After School Club, run by Corby Council, which means that we can offer wrap-around care from 8am to 4.30pm every day.

The aspirational curriculum at **Gretton Primary Academy is** both exciting and engaging and is underpinned by the National Curriculum. The curriculum has been carefully designed to develop the whole child through four main strands:

- Philosophical encouraging critical thinking and reasoning
- Practical promoting hands-on and reallife experiences
- Emotional embracing the best that has been thought, said and created
- Intellectual enabling children to know more, remember more and do more

We aim for high academic achievement within our curriculum. English and mathematics have a dedicated teaching time in the day to ensure that foundational skills are learnt and then practised, applied and consolidated in our theme and skillsbased work.

The curriculum in Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 incorporates the essential knowledge and skills of the National Curriculum alongside providing enquiry, cultural capital and practical, purposeful first-hand experiences so that children develop an emotional connection to, and an understanding of, their place in the world. Learning focuses on a clear progression of key skills and knowledge alongside essentials for learning and life through a termly theme. All themes include a real-life or visual experience, such as a visitor coming into school or an educational visit to inspire children's interest and provide a purpose and context for learning.

Careful ongoing assessment of learning ensures that all children benefit from personalised learning directly relevant to their needs.





English **Developing confident** 7 communication

Learning to read is a priority for every child at Gretton. Children receive daily phonics teaching in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 following the Read, Write Inc. scheme. The teaching of reading and comprehension continues throughout Key Stage 2 through guided reading and comprehension sessions. We expect all children to read at home at least five times a week and this is monitored in school. To enhance our reading curriculum we have a newly refurbished library at the heart of the school which is stocked with thousands of books. We also have a reading dog called Walter who comes into school regularly to sit with the children whilst they are reading.

Language development underpins the wider English curriculum and children are encouraged to develop excellent communication skills, both written and verbal, which can be used confidently and successfully in all aspects of life. In line with the latest research, there is a strong emphasis on talk to promote good writing skills. Younger children engage with a wide range of stories and rhymes to encourage them to develop their ideas for writing. Older children are exposed to high quality texts and explore the features of the focus genre type in depth. Teachers also focus on the key skills of spelling, punctuation, grammar and handwriting to ensure that our current high standards are maintained.

We strive to make English teaching and learning an integral part of our creative curriculum, with children using their knowledge from science or topic themed lessons as a purposeful stimulus for high quality writing. Children have daily writing opportunities that support their next steps in learning. Across a year, children will be taught to write a range of narrative, nonnarrative and poetic genres and experiences and creative hooks are used to provide children with a wide range of reasons to write to give purpose to their work.

Mathematics Deepening logical thinking

Mathematics is led by our specialist mathematics teacher and follows the latest developments in the National

+-×= Curriculum. Our aim is to develop a passion for mathematics in our children, by making lessons practical, fun and engaging. We believe in building confident and competent mathematicians, who feel empowered to ask questions and delve further in their learning.

At Gretton Primary Academy, we firmly believe in helping children to build a solid foundation of basic mathematical knowledge and skills, which they can then use and apply, in a variety of ways, to solve problems and find answers to challenging concepts. We help children to do this by ensuring they have consolidated their learning, whilst challenging them and deepening their understanding.

Where possible, mathematics is related to reallife situations and practical life skills, but we also vary the resources and representations children use in their lessons to deepen understanding.

Science Inspiring Awe and Wonder

The science curriculum at Gretton Primary Academy is fun and inspires awe and wonder in our world. We aim to encourage our children to develop their scientific thinking through handson exploration and experimentation alongside a deeper knowledge and understanding of the natural and man-made worlds. Scientific knowledge and skills are taught through communication, application, investigation, observation and problem-solving activities.

Where possible, scientific skills are linked to the termly theme, or developed through visitors and trips to give real relevance to the children's learning. This cohesive approach leads the children to enjoy new scientific discoveries, inspiring them and equipping them with the skills to shape how we live in our rapidly changing society.



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Physical activity

Encouraging teamwork

Children participate in two timetabled hours of physical activity each week, which vary from gymnastics, dance, forest school, swimming, invasion games, specific team games and more. We also have fantastic links with local sporting companies, who provide excellent professional development to staff, whilst simultaneously delivering fantastic sessions to the children. We have termly whole school activity days and workshops, such as hula hooping, hockey, skipping, freestyle football, scootering, circus skills and much more. We also enjoy sporting treats in individual year groups such as outdoor residential visits and sailing at Rutland Water.

At Gretton, we ensure that every child is able to take part in a range of inter-school and in-school sporting competitions, with a key focus on promoting good sportsmanship (which is one of our school values). We pride ourselves on working with our wonderful children, who can work well as a team, praise each other and have fun in a game.

Children learn how to care for their bodies, both physically and mentally, and are encouraged to develop a growing self-awareness, a positive attitude and a commitment to self-improvement through setting goals, so that they are ultimately able to influence their own quality of life.

Celebrating the Arts Art, Music & Design & Technology



Our curriculum includes a range of activities in all areas of the arts including dance, drama and music as well as art and design.

Understanding of arts and artists is part of every theme with a strong creative element each term to provide a visual product related to or inspiring the children's work. Relevant individual artists, periods, artistic skills and techniques are explored and developed as our children progress through the school.

We offer many opportunities for the children to celebrate their artistic learning and achievement. An example is the Take One Picture initiative, run by the National Gallery in London, in which children produce work for art gallery to share with parents inspired by an important piece of art. This initiative also means that each child leaves our school with a deep knowledge and appreciation of seven important works of art.

The design and technology curriculum provides children with the ability to think critically and problem solve, giving them a solid foundation for future learning, plus transferable skills that can be used across the curriculum.



Geography

Geography allows our children to gain essential knowledge about the world around them alongside developing fieldwork skills. Our geography curriculum is built around core concepts which build in complexity as the children move from Early Years through to Year 6: Location and Place knowledge, Human and Physical, Human Impact on Environment and Sustainability, Culture and Connections and Fieldwork. We aspire for our children to become empathetic about the world and to do their best to protect it.

History

We bring history to life through artefacts, discussion, visits and drama to ensure children have practical, purposeful and first-hand experiences to help them to develop a sense of period. Children learn about the past by exploring chronology, significant people and events and continuity and change across eras. We want our children to think critically, evaluate sources of evidence and give their opinions. They develop an understanding of historical enquiry by continually reflecting on key concepts throughout their journey through the school including diversity and migration, empire and civilisation, invaders and settlers and the rule of law.

Computing

Computing is crucial in this rapidly developing digital world and plays a major part within all areas of learning. The computing curriculum enables children to develop an understanding of the principles of computer science, to practise creating and writing computer programs and evaluate and apply information technology to solve problems. Coding is used to boost logical thinking and touch-screen laptops to enhance children's learning journey and to best prepare them for their future.

Religious Education

Within the statutory area of religion, children learn about the main features and teachings of Christianity and other key religious faiths. We aim for children to develop skills and knowledge in order to make decisions about important questions and also to gain a greater understanding of the world in which they live. During their time at Gretton children will visit the church of St James the Great and Baptist chapel in Gretton and at least one other place of worship from another major world faith.

Languages - Latin

Learning a language provides an opening to other cultures and through our Latin curriculum every child to develops a love of both modern and classical languages. Children in Key Stage 2 are introduced to the Latin language and the culture of Roman Britain. We focus on learning some Latin vocabulary and grammar and to understand the links to the English language.



We offer a range of different activities within and beyond the curriculum and try to ensure that there is something accessible and relevant to every individual's strengths and interests.

Work with our **Pastoral Support Assistant** helps to remove barriers to learning and gives children one-to-one time and emotional support to build self-esteem and confidence when they need it.

In enabling children to get the most out of their learning we hope that every single child will achieve their potential and leave the school as a well-rounded, happy and secure individuals with high self-esteem.

Special Educational Needs

At Gretton Primary Academy we make great efforts to include everyone in our activities and learning, whatever their educational needs. Every child has full access to the curriculum and we use a variety of inclusive teaching styles and differentiation to ensure that all children can access learning in the classroom.

If appropriate, children with additional needs have individual learning plans and dedicated support to achieve personalised targets. This enables them to understand the relevance and purpose of learning activities and experience levels of progress that bring feelings of success and achievement.



Parent partnership

We pride ourselves on our strong parent partnerships at Gretton Primary Academy, which are an integral part of belonging to our close village community. We encourage all of our parents to be involved in the life of the school and support their child's learning, as we believe a strong partnership between school and home enables the children to enjoy and achieve the best they can. There are regular opportunities to meet teachers, see children's work, participate in questionnaires and attend concerts and assemblies.

In Foundation Stage and Year 1 there are regular **'Stay and Play'** or **'Come and Read'** sessions for parents to share in learning activities with their child. Our learning log provides a daily link between home and school.

We also have a very active PSA (Parent and School Association) that meets regularly to organise fundraising and social events for the school.

Their fundraising efforts have enabled us to significantly improve our outdoor learning space. All parents are most welcome to be involved in the work of the PSA.

Attendance High Engagement

We are pleased that our children want to attend their academy and know that excellent attendance really matters. Those who have good attendance get better jobs in the future, achieve better results, make better friendships and have good self-esteem and confidence. To promote good attendance and punctuality, awards are given during, and at the end of the school year. Children value these awards and they appreciate their parents' support in gualifying for them.

Looking smart

We have a fantastic uniform at Gretton Primary Academy that the children are proud of. It helps to support the ethos and culture which we promote and, as such, it is expected that all children wear the correct logoed uniform.

This helps to keep them safe and suitably dressed for school life, visits and activities. We are proud of the fact that the children's appearance is commented on when we take part in festivals, visits and sporting events. Uniform is available only through our supplier **Karl Sports**.
